

- 1. 1996-2009: Technical Assistance to the Community of Independent States Cross-Border Co-operation (TACIS CBC)
- 2. 2007-2013: European Neighbourhood and Partnership Instrument (ENPI)
 - 3. 2014-2020: European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI)
- 4. 2021-2027: Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument Global Europe (NDICI-Global Europe)

and EU Reactions...

- 5. 28 February 2022: Ukraine sent its application for EU membership
- 6. 23 June 2022: Ukraine was given a European perspective and granted candidate status by unanimous agreement between the leaders of all 27 MSs
- 7. 20 June 2023: EC proposal to set up a new Ukraine Facility to support Ukraine's recovery, reconstruction and modernisation





EU projects reacting to help Ukraine in the face of Russian agression before 24 February 2022 after 24 February 2022

 more than 200 EU-funded projects in Ukraine across a wide range of sectors, regions and cities, supporting its ambitious reform agenda the EU delegation to Ukraine and EU projects working with Ukraine rapidly repurposed their activities in the face of the humanitarian crisis and the massive displacement of populations

"On good neighbourly relations and regional cooperation, Ukraine maintains good bilateral relations with other enlargement countries and with neighbouring EU Member States. These have been strengthened amidst Russia's war of aggression leading to further deepening cooperation with many of those countries, marked by a number of high-level visits and considerable humanitarian, military and financial support."



Cross-border co-operations in the light of EU accession

Dimensions of cross-border partnership

Horizontal dimensions

- border regions represent 40% of EU territory and 30% of the EU's population
- cross-border partnerships are minilaboratories of the European integration processes: best field to experience the advantages and disadvantages of integration
- potential and important catalysts for European Territorial Cohesion

Vertical dimensions

- actors are involved on equivalent levels (local, regional, national) on both sides of the bordera
- shared cross-border services with joint administrative competences



- and to help to overcome regional development disadvantages caused by separation through national borders



TRANSPORT AND MOBILITY:

Together with Zakarpatska County for improving transport security

The result of the project is an application accessible through the Internet which shows the current traffic situation on a point-based map, thus facilitating more seamless and more secure passenger and cargo traffic along the route Hungary-Ukraine. This system can also be used by the population through the Internet: information can be gathered on frequent accident locations, roadblocks, detours and road closures.






2007-2013: Analysis of participation at the European level


Levels of participation








Conclusions

 - more than 4 partners in 30% of the projects
- the projects are in compliance with the accession criteria and assist to meet the requirements as set in the 35 Chapters
